They have already hosted breakfast for the post, Blood Drive, and an Eagle Court of Honor, and that is just the beginning!

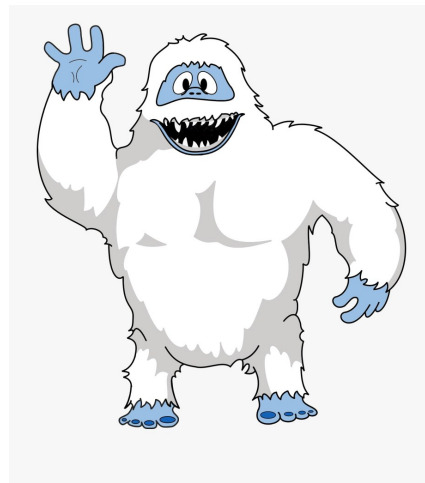
With February just around the corner there is more to come. With just less than 2 weeks away a couple of the Scout and parents are going to a Winter camp trip. Klondike.

Preserving the Heart of America's Democracy

President James Buchanan once remarked, "I like the noise of democracy." America provides citizens a sacred opportunity for everyone to share their voices with our government. My voice in our democracy carries principles of hard work and passion, champions the diverse fabric of our nation, and advocates for public education.

First, my voice in democracy demonstrates the power of dreams and perseverance. The concept that anyone can succeed with their aspirations and resilience drives the American voice. A study from The Harvard Business Review finds that sixty percent of chief executive officers owe their success to motivation and passion. Furthermore, a Developmental Psychology study claims that aspirations as a youth increases completion of higher education and raises income by twenty-five percent. Evidently, the promise of the American dream drives our country and motivates us to be successful. Essentially, my voice in democracy urges people to find their calling and fulfill it wholeheartedly. As Martin Luther King Junior reminds us, anything is possible with a dream.

Finally, my voice fights for American public education. Nelson Mandela once remarked, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." Public schools nurture learners in a crucial way. Instead of a censored education, public schools embody the "messiness" needed to understand the world. A study by the Center for American Progress found that public school students are thirty-five percent more likely to discuss "difficult" topics like inequality and racism, which are essential for being an informed and impactful citizen. As an attendee of a diverse and noisy public school myself, my voice amplifies their importance when uplifted and supported.

Ultimately, my voice embodies the perseverance and passion that has made our nation prosper and expresses the importance of pluralism and public education in fostering youth.
